


ABOUT AFCC OUR PURPOSE

OUR CORE SERVICES: SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY

The Aboriginal Friendship Centre of Calgary offers holistic, culturally-grounded support through four key service pillars, designed to meet diverse needs and empower our urban Indigenous community:

- ❖ **Community Outreach & Cultural Reconnection:** Rekindling heritage, fostering belonging, building community ties.
- ❖ **Housing Services:** Providing safe, affordable, and culturally appropriate homes & support.
- ❖ **Community Member Services:** Access to essential resources, support networks, and personal growth.
- ❖ **Elders Services:** Honouring our wisdom keepers with dedicated care, programs, and spaces.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

&

CULTURAL RECONNECTION

We rekindle heritage, foster belonging, and build vibrant community ties for urban Indigenous peoples through shared cultural experiences and traditional teachings.



Encampment Support: Our team meets community where they are, offering culturally-grounded support and the first point of connection on their path to healing and stability.

Honouring the Bonds: This program strengthens kinship by helping young families reconnect with traditional culture and values. It focuses on building healthy foundations through shared cultural learning and community support

Honouring Life: Designed for youth, this initiative provides a safe space for land-based camps, mentorship, and identity discovery. Our team helps youth navigate the transition to adulthood by anchoring them in ceremony and ancestral teachings



HOUSING SERVICES: SAFE HOMES, STRONG FUTURES



The Aboriginal Friendship Centre of Calgary (AFCC) is committed to addressing housing insecurity by providing safe, stable, and culturally appropriate housing solutions and supports to foster well-being for our community members in Calgary.

Omahkitapiyis Elders' Lodge Apartments

Our award-winning Omahkitapiyis Elders' Lodge is a 12-unit, non-market apartment building owned and operated by AFCC. It offers fully furnished, independent living that honours the dignity and wisdom of Indigenous seniors. With culturally enriched spaces for ceremonies and community gatherings, and the dedicated support of an on-site Cultural Coordinator, the Lodge is a place of vibrant cultural connection.

The Bromley Place Apartments

An 8-unit building owned and operated by the AFCC, Bromley Place provides safe, independent living in 1-bedroom units for community members requiring housing support. AFCC has invested significantly to renovate and maintain the property, ensuring a dignified and supportive home for all tenants.

Aboriginal Housing Initiative (AHI)

The Aboriginal Housing Initiative walks alongside Indigenous adults to foster stability and personal wellness through culturally grounded, one-on-one support. Our team assists community members in navigating systems and securing essentials like ID and tenant rights, empowering them to thrive on their own terms.

Access Note: AHI intake is managed exclusively through Calgary's Coordinated Access and Assessment (CAA) system via SORCe.

Indigenous Women Safe Housing Project

We are building a 18-unit sanctuary in Crescent Heights, providing a safe, culturally grounded haven for Indigenous women, including singles, mothers with children, and Elders. This project fosters healing and stability through a mix of dignified housing and traditional spaces, ensuring every generation of women has a secure place to call home.

COMMUNITY SERVICES:

Grounded in our cultural values, AFCC provides essential resources and support networks to empower Indigenous individuals and families on their path to well-being and growth.

Our key services include:

Justice Program

This program supports community reintegration and crime prevention through one-on-one counselling, traditional teachings, and sacred practices focused on healing and accountability. By collaborating with Indigenous Court and police services, our Coordinator provides a holistic support network to help participants maintain stability and prevent relapse.

Status Card Clinic

AFCC provides crucial assistance with Secure Certificate of Indian Status (Status Card) applications and renewals at the Navigation & Support Centre. We now also offer registration services under the Indian Act, guiding eligible individuals through the process of being registered for the first time.

Navigation & Support Centre Services

As a vital partner at the Salvation Army's Navigation and Support Centre of Hope, AFCC provides the dedicated Indigenous cultural support on-site. From our desk, a staff member offers a culturally safe connection point, guiding individuals to a wide network of resources and back to AFCC's own cultural programs and ceremonies.

Other Key Supports

Our team walks alongside community members, offering holistic support. We provide referrals and resources for essential needs, and foster cultural connection by hosting community events and linking individuals to traditional resources and programming.



ELDERS SERVICES

HONOURING OUR WISDOM KEEPERS



Honouring our Elders as the heart of our community, AFCC is dedicated to providing culturally rich programs and welcoming spaces that support their well-being and celebrate their vital role as wisdom keepers. Our support for Elders is built on two key pillars: a place to gather and a place to call home.



KANAKAATSI'NOM - ELDERS' DROP-IN CENTRE

Meaning 'All Friends Place,' Kanakaatsi'nom is Calgary's first dedicated Indigenous Elders' drop-in centre. It is a vibrant and welcoming space where Elders can gather for cultural activities, share language, participate in ceremonies, and enjoy the support of their community. Laughter and kinship are at the heart of the Centre, located at 4630 16 Ave NW.




OMAHKITAPIYOIS- ELDERS' LODGE APARTMENTS

OUR IMPACT: STRENGTHENING COMMUNITY, TOGETHER.

Every day, AFCC works to create meaningful change and build pathways to healing, connection, and well-being. Our impact is seen not just in numbers, but in the strengthened spirit of our urban Indigenous community. Here are a few highlights of what we've achieved together.

By the Numbers:

- The SCIS Clinic has now assisted nearly 1500 clients, providing essential support to Indigenous community members in need of SCIS and registration services. This growing demand reflects how vital and valued this service is within the community.
- Over 5,600 bagged lunches were provided to community members in need in a single quarter, offering vital nourishment and a moment of connection.

Building for the Future:

- Safe Housing for Indigenous Women: AFCC is building an 18-unit sanctuary providing safe, culturally grounded, and permanent homes for Indigenous women, children, and Elders.
- Holy Gathering Place: Now open, Naatowápítao'ohkánnao'p is a dedicated 1,000-square-foot holy gathering place for Indigenous ceremony and community connection.

Community Recognition:

- The Calgary Award (2024): We were honoured to be the first-ever Indigenous organization to receive the prestigious Community Advocate Organization award.
- Art Smith Award: Our Omahkitapiyis Elders' Lodge was recognized with the Art Smith Award for Building of the Year, celebrating its excellence in design and community impact.
